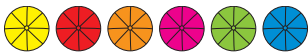

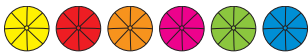

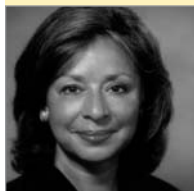

**Advancing Gender and Ethnic Diversity in Biomedical Leadership: A Personal Perspective**

Enhancing attention to women's health and health disparities through research has presented opportunities to devote considerable thought to past and present efforts to define, and overcome, barriers that confront women and minorities in their quest to achieve leadership positions in biomedical careers, and to sustain that advancement. The NIH has recently undertaken several directed efforts related to women in research careers, and many professional organizations and academicians have brought renewed interest to issues

of the gender factor in medical and research careers. But, another dimension also exists—that of the ethnic minority, including declining males of some groups, in medical careers and the contrasts and similarities to issues and barriers for women. Personal reflections and perspectives on these issues will be discussed along with challenges for “Creating a Better Tomorrow” that must include active strategies to enhance career opportunities for the diversity of tomorrow's peoples and the health challenges that diversity may well continue to present.
