
Teaching Hospitals Invested Disproportionately in Capacity Expansion to Meet the Needs of COVID-19 Patients

In FY2020 teaching hospitals invested a disproportionate share to ramp up efforts as hospitals expanded their capacity due to the COVID-19 pandemic. For instance, 76% of major teaching hospitals compared to only 55% of non-teaching hospitals set up and staffed temporary spaces. Although major teaching hospitals make up 24% of inpatient beds at short-term general hospitals, they accounted for 46% of the increased expansion in pediatric ventilator capacity and 36% of expansion in adult ventilator capacity.
